II. RULES DISCUSSION

A. 64B4-2.002, Definition of Supervision for Clinical Social Work, Marriage & Family Therapy and Mental Health Counseling

Mr. Frizzell introduced the rule to the Board.

E. 64B4-22.110, Course Content (TS 00:54:15)

Ms. Hartman introduces the rule and the removal previously required course content in statute. The Board considers removal of the term university sponsored in practicum requirements in rule.

Dr. Day addressed updating the psychopathology requirement to include the most current DSM. Dr. Vicencio states that it maybe to narrow of a definition as DSM editions change and different methods are being taught.

After discussion, rule 64B4-22.110 will be brought back during the May 6, 2021 meeting to revisit language changes after more research in Dr. Day and Dr. Vicencio's points.

F. Definition of a Private Practice (TS 01:10:25)



Mr. Frizzell discussed the possibility of creating a definition of private practice in relation to Florida Statutes chapter 491.005. After discussion, the rule will be moved to the May 6, 2021 meeting with possible language presented.
